Drums are struck with the player's hands, or with a drumstick, to produce sound.

The oldest drums were made out of hollowed logs. Later, animal skins were used to cover the top of the drum.

Drums were originally used as a form of communication, to send signals.

A drum set (or drum kit) usually includes a bass drum, a snare drum, several cymbals, and tom toms.


The first drum sets were put together over a 100 years ago.


The Purdue Big Bass Drum is a marching band drum and is more than 3 m high.


