Prepositional Phrases

A preposition describes the relationship between a noun or pronoun to another word in a sentence.

For example:

She sat on the chair.

I will go to the shops after breakfast.

I picked all the roses except the yellow ones.

Jazzy was hiding under the table.

We will meet after breakfast.

They walked across the road.

A preposition and its object are a prepositional phrase.

Prepositional phrases add meaning to nouns and verbs in sentences. They are like adverbs or adjectives.

Prepositional phrases locate nouns and pronouns in time, space, direction or situation. A prepositional phrase does not contain a verb.

Examples of prepositional phrases:

We met at the train station.

Look at the man with three dogs.

I don't want to go running because of my cough.

An old woman with white hair sat next to me.

James walked behind the desk.
