
Modal verbs



A modal verb is a special type of verb. They modify the main verb.

Modal verbs give information about the degree of obligation or certainty involved in the action.

Modal verbs are: can, could, may, might, will, would, shall, should, must.

Sue may have written the letter. Sue must have written the letter.

Jim must postpone the meeting. Jim may postpone the meeting.

Low modality shows less certainty.

I <u>might</u> leave work early today. You <u>could</u> cook dinner tomorrow.



High modality shows a high degree of certainty.

I <u>must</u> leave work early today. You <u>must</u> cook dinner tomorrow.
