The optometrist did lots of tests to check the health of my eye. He looked right inside my eye with a microscope to see that everything was functioning properly.

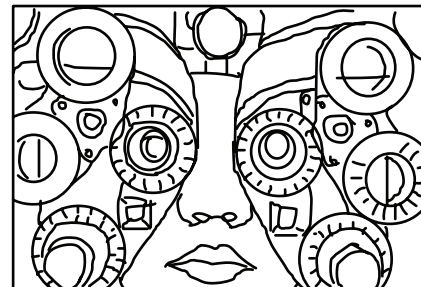
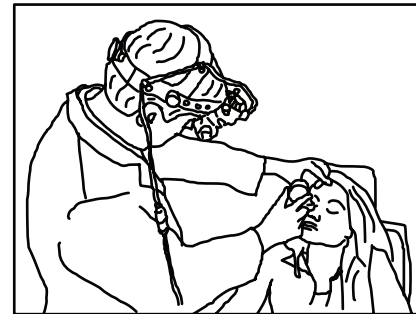
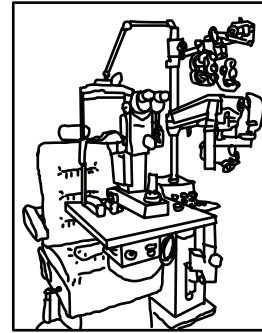
Then I had to read some letters on a chart. Some of the smaller letters looked a bit fuzzy.

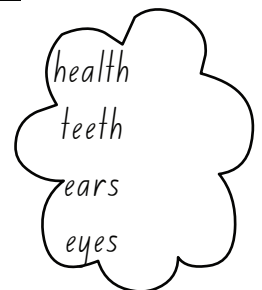

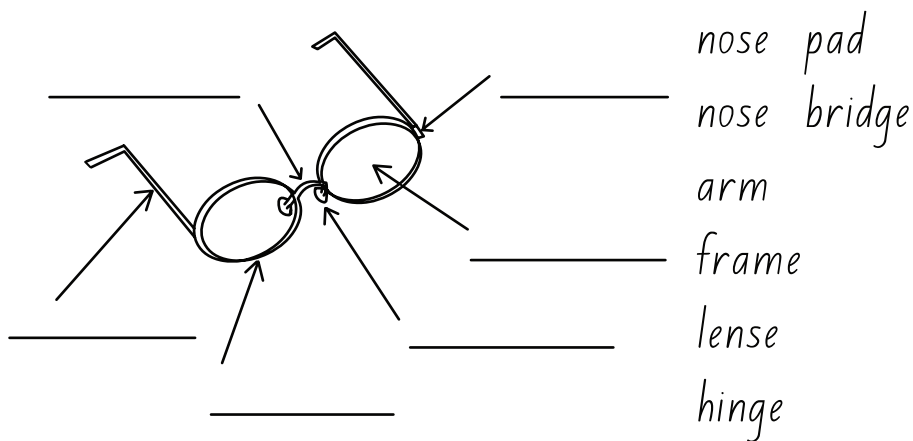
