Interjections

An interjection is a part of speech that usually expresses emotion or strong feelings like; surprise, happiness, excitement, anger, disgust or passion.

Interjections can stand alone, or be placed before or after a sentence. Often an interjection is followed by a punctuation mark, usually an exclamation mark.

Examples of interjections:

Hey! Get off my bike!

Good! Now we all agree.

Oops! Sorry about that.

Phew! That was close.

Yes! I want to come.

Mmm, I can't decide what to eat.

Ahh, now I see what you mean.

Ouch! That really hurt.

Wow! That's wonderful news.
