Hippopotamus Facts

• The hippopotamus is the third largest living land mammal after the elephant and rhinoceros.



• 'Hippo' comes from an ancient Greek word meaning 'river horse'.

• Hippos have very thick, smooth skin and are nearly hairless.

• Hippos are semi-aquatic, which means they live on land and in water. They spend the day in rivers, lakes and swamps, but emerge at dusk to graze on grass.

• Hippos are one of the most dangerous animals in Africa. They can outrun a human on land and their long sharp teeth or tusks can bite a boat in half.

• Hippos can stay under water for up to 6 minutes.

Gestures

A gesture is movement of part of the body to express an idea or feeling. For example, shaking your fist at someone when you're angry. When a hippo opens its mouth wide, it's not yawning, it's actually a threat gesture to its enemies meaning 'go away' or 'don't come any closer'.

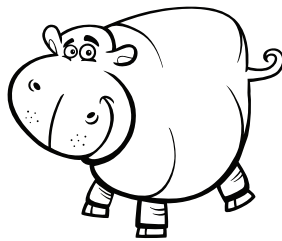

Collective Nouns

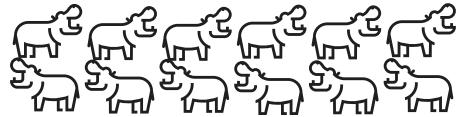
A group of hippos is called a 'herd', 'pod', 'dale' or 'bloat'.

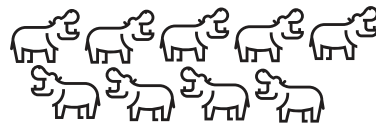
Number Crunchers
